**Turnstyle Thrift Shop – Vintage Finds That Fund Futures** 



For over 60 years, Turnstyle Thrift Shop, operated by the Assistance League of San Mateo County, has supported students through scholarships at Cañada College, College of San Mateo, and Skyline College. Each year, proceeds from the thrift shop provide financial assistance to students facing economic barriers, helping them stay in school and achieve their educational goals.

Since its inception, the Turnstyle Scholarship Program has awarded thousands of dollars in scholarships, making higher education more accessible for local students. Last year, six students received \$3,050 each to support their academic journey, including Alina Lysak and Johanna Lopez from Cañada College, Lola Sullivan and Myesha Reed from College of San Mateo, and Erin Denny and Me Me Hlaing Oo from Skyline College.
